
The United States has consented to magistrate judge jurisdiction in all cases in which plaintiff seeks review, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 405(g), of a decision by the Commissioner of Social Security subject to reserved rights to withdraw the consent in a given case and to withdraw the general consent. The cases include all matters identified on the Civil Cover Sheet (JS44c) in Section IV (Nature of Suit) as 863, 864 or 865.

Promptly after the filing of all such cases, the Clerk shall direct a communication to all parties:

- (a). Identifying the judge to whom the case has been assigned;
- (b). Providing a basic fact sheet, in a form approved by the court, explaining consent references to magistrate judges;
- (c). Confirming that any withdrawal of consent by the United States must be filed no later than the date the United States files its answer to the complaint;
- (d). Notifying plaintiff's counsel (or plaintiff pro se) of plaintiff's right to consent to magistrate judge jurisdiction, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(c);

- (e). Providing a consent form for plaintiff to consider, and advising plaintiff that if plaintiff wishes to consent, the executed form must be mailed to the Clerk by the date designated on the consent form; and
- (f). Advising the parties as to the court's procedure in the absence of consent.
