Standing Order 2022-20


The following persons shall not enter any United States Courthouse in the District of Oregon:

- i. Persons who have tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 5 days, day 1 being the first full day following the date of the test;
- ii. Persons who have tested positive for COVID-19 more than 5 days previously who have not been fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) and whose symptoms are not improving;
- iii. Persons who are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 and have not received results from a test since the onset of symptoms; and
- iv. Persons who have been asked to self-isolate or self-quarantine by a medical professional or public health authority and whose isolation or quarantine period has not concluded.

Masks are optional in the public areas of the district courthouses. With respect to courtrooms and adjacent spaces, a judge may determine whether to require individuals to wear a mask. Standing Order 2022-15 is vacated.

The United States Marshal, his deputies, and the Court Security Officers shall enforce this Order and deny entry to anyone attempting to enter in violation of this Order.
