
Some Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, such as Rules 10(b)(2), 15(c)(1)(A), 20(a)(1), 23(a)(1), 32(e), 43(b)(2), allow for consent or waiver of certain rights by a defendant, but require that such consent or waiver be in writing. More broadly, various documents, including but not limited to financial affidavits, plea petitions, and waivers of indictment, call for the signatures of defendants, counsel, and/or judges.

The Court accepts such documents with electronic signatures.

Further, where a defendant's signature is called for, defense counsel may sign on the defendant's behalf if the defendant, after an opportunity to consult with counsel, consents, and counsel notes that consent on the document itself.
